To Whom It May Concern:

Teachers participating in the Teacher Leadership Program of the 2017 IAS/Park City Mathematics Institute are eligible to enroll for credit in Math 497: Mathematics Topics for Teachers, reflecting the substantial work in mathematics and mathematics education in this program.

A teacher who fully participates and completes the PCMI program receives a grade of Credit for 6 quarter credits (which is equivalent to 4 semester credits).

This is a course at the graduate level. Courses numbered at the 400 level at the University of Washington may be applied as credit in appropriate graduate programs. In particular numerous students enrolled in Masters and Doctorate programs in Mathematics Education have received graduate credit for this course, as well as some Master's students in Mathematics.

The transcript for the course will say that the course is not for graduate credit but this simply means that the student was not enrolled in a graduate program at the UW, so it does not apply towards any UW graduate degree. This does not reflect the level of the course.
